Have you ever had a thought, feeling or felt like you had something to share?


Are there things we don't see enough of? Would you like to share something anonymously?

Perhaps we don't feel we have ways to communicate how we feel or what we think... or don't know where to start.


With this activity we hope you might find an enjoyable way to be creative and put something out into the world/community or in your own home to remind ourselves of the things we like or are important to us however small or big.

We hope to provide you with a place to start.

Carbon paper image/lettering:



1. Take the carbon paper & your chosen image or text.



Use your carbon paper dull side up / shiny side down to trace over words/letters/photos or images from anything you can find that might help you to express you, your interests or something you would like to share with others.

2. Place the image on top of the carbon paper, making sure the carbon paper is shiny side down.

Tips:

Don't press too hard.

Go on an alphabet hunt to find all the letters you want - Collect as much as you can to work from - Find some images on paper form magazines.

For tracing things from paper images (magazines, leaflets, – use carbon paper.

For tracing from hard surfaces (cardboard boxes and packaging, hardback books) or things you don't want to ruin like story books or photographs use the tracing paper.

Mix with drawing and writing

Ask yourself a question: what would I like to see most or more of?

Use pictures or words that say:

- 1. One thing you are proud of...
 - 2. One thing you want more of...
 - 3. One thing you think expresses something about you...
 - 4. One thing you'd like to try one day...
 - 5. Something that has surprised you...



3. Once the image is on top of the carbon paper use a pen or pencil to trace the image, making sure to only put pressure on the parts you want to use in your poster.

Suggestions:

Try coming up with 2 to 5 words that tell people what you are thinking about or that you want to share. Pair this up with an image you like.

It could be your favourite; character, superhero, animal, place, activity, sport, film, story, tv programme, book, plant, insect, vegetable, song lyrics, bands, comics, movements or youtuber.

Find a place to leave the poster or put it up at home!



dry on the paper.










As the dark nights draw in its a great time to go outside and get to know the night skies

Remember to stay safe
when you go outside at
night, you can go in a group
with friends or family





Have you ever seen a shooting star? If the answer is no then hopefully this month you will get your chance.

On the 17th of November the Leonids meteor shower will peak and if the skies are clear you are almost guaranteed a show to remember.

The shower occurs at the same time each year as the earth passes through the debris of a large comet called Tempel Tuttle.

This debris gets caught in the path of the Earth, burns up in our atmosphere and appears in our sky as meteors, or shooting stars.

If you are able to get to a rural location, away from street lights, you will have a better chance of seeing more Leonids but even in a city location it should be possible to see up to 10 an hour.









Get outside, wrap up warm and pack a warm drink to keep you cosy as you lean back and keep your eyes peeled.

They will range in brightness with some of the fainter ones being hard to spot due to the light of the moon but the bright ones will be easily noticeable and if your lucky you may even see what is referred to as an Earth Grazer.

These large comets are incredibly bright and their tails can hang in the sky for a few seconds after they fly over.



The LeonidS will be visible across the sky but radiate from the constellation of Leo, hence the name. See if you can find the constellation in the sky, don't worry if you can't though as the meteors will be visible across the sky.



take natures egg test

One of the wonderful things about the winter months is that the dark nights really bring the stars to life.

A small cluster of stars that are only visible to us during these months is the Pleiades (pronounced play-dees), also known as the 7 sisters.

On a clear night scan the skies for a patch of stars, tightly grouped together in a fuzzy little group.

They can be found diagonally up and to the right of the constellation Orion (as seen in the next page).


As your eyes adjust you will notice that the individual stars can be defined from each other.

The more stars you can see, the better your eyesight.

Legend has it that if you are able to count 7 stars then you are a warrior, fit for battle!



ABERDEEN PEOPLES PRESS (APP) STARTED IN 1973 AND ENDED IN 1984, DURING THIS TIME THEY PUBLISHED A NEWSPAPER EVERY 2 WEEKS, HIGHLIGHTING AND PUBLICISING LOCAL MATTERS IN ABERDEEN.

NOT ONLY DID APP SUPPORT ABERDEEN PEOPLE, THEY PROVIDED A PRINTING SERVICE FOR DIFFERENT GROUPS ACROSS SCOTLAND AND THE UK, SUCH AS RADICAL GROUPS, COMMUNITY NEWSPAPERS, TRADE UNIONS AND CAMPAIGNING ORGANISATIONS. ALLOWING THEIR VOICES TO BE HEARD BY A WIDER AUDIENCE.

ABERDEEN PEOPLES PRESS PROVIDED A SPACE FOR YOUNG PEOPLE TO VOICE THEIR CONCERNS AND BELIEFS, ACTING AS A MEETING PLACE AND SOCIAL HUB FOR THE CITY'S GROUPS TO COME TOGETHER.
